






## NATIONAL INSTITUTE FOR FOREST PRODUCTS INNOVATION

- Commenced in 2017
- Three Centers:
  - Launceston 2 funding rounds 17 Projects
  - **Gippsland** 3 funding rounds 12 Projects
  - Mount Gambier 4 funding rounds 22 Projects
- \$15 Million Federal and State Governments funding
- Matching (or better) Industry, University and State
   Government Agencies cash and in-kind.
- Each Centre had its own Committee reviewed project applications.
- **FWPA** provided secretariat services to all Centers



#### Sustainable forests

- tree breeding and genetics
- digital technology for forest management, monitoring and inventory
- improved silvicultural management
- First Nations peoples' participation in production forest management
- natural capital accounting and maximising multiple forest benefits
- management of biodiversity, conservation and threatened species in a production landscape
- management of forest health, pests and diseases, including biosecurity
- fire management in a changing climate in the production landscape
- farm forestry in a productive landscape.

# Making the most of our available wood fibre

- product segregation and greater value recovery from existing resources
- · wood and paper products
- innovative value adding to wood fibre
- biomaterial development
- new engineered wood solutions for construction
- improved supply chain
- transport logistics
- safety improvements, including fatigue management
- improved processing efficiency
- digital technologies, sensing machine learning and artificial intelligence applications in processing
- increasing wood fibre products contribution to the bioeconomy and circular economy






## **Australian Forest and Wood Innovations - Funding**
